Nathan Matias '05 - His Philadelphia Fullerine was awarded the "Best of Show" in the Student Art Show on April 3, 2005.

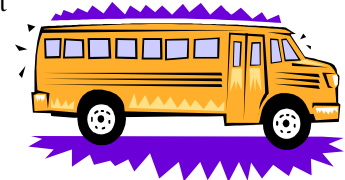
NYC Trip a Success
