Student works largely independently, with oversight from a faculty supervisor.	Student and supervising faculty member work closely throughout the semester.	Faculty member works closely with the student to provide instruction on the topic.
Requires no additional tuition fee because the student assumes the bulk of the responsibility and there is less oversight from the sponsoring faculty member.	An additional tuition fee of \$100/credit is charged and must be paid before the Directed Study can be registered. Assumes moderate amount of faculty supervision	An additional tuition fee of \$150/credit is charged and must be paid before the Tutorial can be registered. Assumes greatest amount of faculty supervision.

REGISTRATION: The deadline to add these courses is the same as for any other course addition: No later than 4:00 pm on the 5th day of the semester. <u>All</u> paperwork, signatures, approvals, and fees (if applicable) must be completed in time to register the course by the end of the regular ADD period. Students can NOT add an independent study, directed study, or tutorial at any point during the semester.

COURSE NUMBERS: Because a Directed Study is used to register a course in the Catalog, it uses the same course number as the regular course and the section number of DS. Independent Studies are registered as 481-484, depending on the number of credits, with the departmental course code of the faculty supervisor (e.g., CS 481 is sponsored by a Computer Science faculty member and is awarded 1 credit; PH 484 sponsored by a Philosophy faculty member and is awarded 4 credits). Tutorials are registered as 379 with the departmental course code of the instructor and the section number of TU (e.g., PSY 379 TU).
