Acknowledge the great work that you've done – maybe that work is in the classroom, on the stage, on the field, at your church, in your community – or maybe that great work is inside of you


#### The summer moments:

#### First Year Seminar

You will take a First Year Seminar class during your first semester. Each Seminar has a different topic and will assist you in your transition from high school to college.

You'll rank your Seminar choices on the form I just mentioned.

Your First Year Seminar faculty member is your academic advisor for your first semester. You will transition to an advisor in your major during your second semester.

You will have a peer mentor who works with your First Year Seminar. Peer mentors are upperclass students who serve as a guide and mentor to you during your first year at Etown.

You will meet your peer mentor and First Year Seminar faculty member at June Orientation.

If you can't attend, then your peer mentor will contact you via email the following week & will set up a group chat for the summer.

# Modern Language Placement Exam

All students are required to complete one modern or ancient language course as part of the Elizabethtown College core program.

Students who studied Spanish, French or German in high school and wish to continue studying at Etown MUST complete the Modern Language Placement Exam for that language. Students are not allowed to take the first entry-level course of a language if they completed level 3 or higher in high school, regardless of placement exam results.

Students who are accepted to the International Business program MUST take the Modern Language Placement Exam.

You will need your Etown Student ID: 1111111

PLACEMENT EXAM INSTRUCTIONS & ACCESS EXAM

- Please take this online assessment by May 24 if possible so that we can use your results to build your fall schedule.
- You can take this assessment through August. When we receive your results, we will update your fall schedule if needed.

If you wish to take a new language that wasn't taken in high school, then you do not need to take the placement exam. You can enroll in one of those classes during your time at Etown.

If you want to study Japanese, you MUST meet with a member of the Japanese Faculty for placement. To arrange an appointment, please contact Dr. Bhattacharya (bhattacharm@etown.edu) or Dr. Takahashi (takahashin@etown.edu).
