# The History of the Church of the Brethren

### **Course Description**

This course examines the Brethren from their origins in Europe to their transplantation and spread in the U.S. and other countries. Topics will include the major divisions, mission work, and interactions with wider Christianity and surrounding cultures. Students will learn about some major leaders and developments among the Brethren. Along with theological concerns, the course will investigate social historical contexts for the Brethren story.

### **Required Texts**

Donald F. Durnbaugh. *Fruit of the Vine*.

James Lehman. The Old Brethren. Nancy Kettering Frye. An Uncommon Woman: The Life and Times of Sarah Righter Major.

All books will be available for purchase at the Young Center.

#### **INSTRUCTOR**



Jeff Bach is a historian of the Brethren. He directs the Young Center at Elizabethtown College, where he teaches Anabaptist and Pietist history. He earned his Ph.D. in religious studies from Duke University in 1997. He is also an ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren.

### **Schedule**

This course will meet at the Young Center, Elizabethtown College on September 27 & 28, and on November 15 & 16, 2019. The class runs from 4:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. each Friday and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each Saturday, with one-hour breaks for meals. Students should also budget time for a significant reading assignment before the first class.

### **Course Objectives**

After successfully completing this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify and describe three significant Brethren leaders and how they helped to shape the history of the Brethren.
- 2. Analyze at least three contributing causes to divisions among the Brethren in the 1880s.
- 3. Describe and explain at least one non-Anglo setting where Brethren spread their faith.
- 4. Name and explain at least two theological developments among the Brethren.
