

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Islam is the fastest growing religion in the US. This course will focus on understanding and experiencing Islam as a local faith practiced by our American neighbors rather than a distant, foreign religion. After introducing the basics of Islam and reviewing Muslims in the US, participants will have opportunities to interact with Muslims in the Harrisburg, PA region. Through a blend of presentations, discussions, and visits to local mosques and Muslim communities, the course will develop basic skills for building positive relationships and Christian witness among Muslims in the US.

INSTRUCTOR



George Pickens, Ph.D.

George Pickens has been teaching Islam and Christian witness among Muslims for over 25 years, first in Africa where he spent 14 years, and currently at Messiah College, where he is Professor of Theology and Director of the Program in Peace and Conflict Studies. George is actively involved in Christian witness among Muslims in the Capital Region of central Pennsylvania, and he is a member of the Mechanicsburg (PA) Church of the Brethren and an ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course aims to teach on several levels. With the Head: Knowing/Understanding

- Students will understand the basic beliefs and practices of Islam.
- Students will engage Islam as a global yet local faith.
- Students will understand the diversity within Islam which makes it a complex mosaic rather than a simple monolith.

With the Heart: Feeling/Believing

- Students will appreciate some of the challenges encountered by Muslims in the United States.
- Students will enrich and deepen their own Christian faith through encounters with Islam and American Muslims.

With the Hands: Doing/Living

- Students will learn basic skills for Christian witness among American Muslims.
- Students will begin to develop positive relational skills with American Muslims.
