Our office assists students with all aspects of their career development, including clarifying their career decisions, crafting plans of action that include activities and professional associations, connecting students with employing organizations, and developing the professional skills needed to reach their goals. By facilitating networking connections, employment, and internship opportunities, Career Development Center empowers students to pursue the recommended 2-3 career-related activities during their time at the College.
