10.Using Zoom to Support Teaching and Research Katie Caprino (Education)

This roundtable session will share how one literacy education professor incorporated Zoom into her teaching and research practices. The presenter will discuss how she facilitated a guest speaking appearance by the Caldecott-winning illustrator in a children's literature course in order to help students interact with a contemporary children's book illustrator and discuss the power of wordless picture books. She will also discuss how she incorporated Zoom to conduct off-campus office hours sessions with students. The participant will also share how Zoom aided researchers on a education department research initiative called Blue Jay Reconnect (a research initiative involving recent program graduates) by alleviating transcription challenges and logistical challenges of having study participants in different locations throughout the United States and the world. Time will be left at the end of the session for participants to ask the presenter questions and to discuss ways in which they might incorporate Zoom effectively into their teaching and / or research practices in upcoming semesters.
