20. Practical Strategies to Include All Students Shannon Haley-Mize (Education)

Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a powerful planning tool that facilitates inclusion through proactive (rather than reactive) removal of barriers in the learning environment and activities that may limit student learning. This session will share ideas for specific, easy-to-implement strategies that exemplify UDL and support access and participation for all students. Several self-assessment tools will be introduced to ensure that participants are empowered to make small changes in course design that have big impact on student engagement and learning.
