Find Library Materials



Quick Search (found in the blue box on the library's homepage) is your gateway to searching across most of our databases, the library catalog, and our journal directory all at once.

To find a complete list of our 140+ individual databases, including our newspaper subscriptions, look for the "Databases and Articles" button on our homepage.

If we are missing the resource you need, you may request a purchase or submit an interlibrary loan request to borrow it from another library.

If you'd like to share a resource with your students, physical items can be placed on reserve at the circulation desk. Digital items, such as ebooks, can easily be shared with students through a link. Always check Quick Search to see if your textbooks are available to students for free!

In-Library Resources



Faculty borrowing periods for most books, DVDs, and CDs are one year. You're also welcome to check out board games for two weeks, laptops for one day, and iPads for three days. Desktop computers, printers, scanners, and a copy machine are also available.

Information Literacy Support & Instruction



Librarians can meet with your class for a workshop on research techniques and library resources, or they can make videos and other resources to share with your class asynchronously. Consider working with the college's Hess Archives to integrate primary sources into your teaching.
