

Textbook Accessibility

Below are some resources for you to more independently acquire accessible textbooks, as well as other accessible books both now and after you graduate.

Increasingly more publishers are making accessible versions of textbooks available for individuals to purchase directly, rather having to first purchase a print version and then requesting the Office of Disability Services inquire whether an accessible version of the text is available from the publisher. Bookshare, VitalSource, and Amazon offer many accessible textbook titles for you to purchase and use with a screen reader of your choice. Information about each is below:

Bookshare <https://www.bookshare.org/cms/> is an accessible on-line library for individuals with print disabilities. It's free for U.S. students with qualifying reading or perceptual disability, a visual impairment, or a physical disability that affects their ability to read printed works - but you need to first sign up. Please contact Disability Services to request a Bookshare account.

VitalSource is a platform for purchasing online textbooks from many major publishers. Their reading platform, Bookshelf, is available for Windows, Mac, iOS, and Android. Please see www.etowncollegestore.com. Any student can purchase through this link <https://etown-store.vitalsource.com/>, which also provides an overview of the product, how it can help students, compatibility with screen readers, magnification, and the ability to change text size and fonts.

Amazon www.amazon.com sells many books as either e-pub files or as kindle versions – both of which are accessible with a screen reader. You can access a free kindle reading app download with the purchase of kindle book https://www.amazon.com/kindle-dbs/fd/kcp/ref=klp_mn

If your textbooks are not available for you to purchase, borrow, or rent through the above resources, please provide the following information to disabilityservices@etown.edu:

- Title, edition, author, ISBN, course name, instructor, proof of purchase of the textbook

If the title is not available through *any* of the above resources, you can mail your print version of the book to Print Services, One Alpha Drive, Elizabethtown College, Elizabethtown Pa, 17022 and they will remove the binding and make a PDF of the textbook for you. Please email copy@etown.edu and disabilityservices@etown.edu before you mail your book so we facilitate the process. This can take a few weeks so please plan accordingly.
