Adjunct Instructor in Introductory Physics

The Department of Engineering and Physics at Elizabethtown College invites applications for adjunct positions in Introductory Physics I and II lecture and laboratory (calculus- and algebra-based) to begin January 1, 2019 and possibly to continue into future semesters depending on staffing needs.

The department offers B.S. degrees in Physics and Physics Education, as well as an ABET accredited degree in Engineering with concentrations in Mechanical, Electrical, Environmental, Civil, Biomedical, and Industrial and Systems. The introductory physics sequence serves students in physics, engineering, chemistry, math education, and those on the pre-med track.

The department consists of 8 full-time faculty members and is located in the Masters Center for Science, Mathematics, and Engineering, a modern facility that hosts smart classrooms; a large lecture hall; collaborative spaces for networking, team building, and group study; and well-equipped labs for mechanics and electronics.
