



Assistant Professor of Psychology-Neuroscience

The Department of Psychology at Elizabethtown College invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in **Neuroscience** beginning July 1, 2019 with teaching responsibilities starting in fall 2019. Area of specialization is open.

Successful candidates will be committed to undergraduate education as well as their own professional development as teacher-scholars. The successful candidate will demonstrate potential for teaching excellence, engage in scholarly work in their field, be eager to mentor undergraduates in research, participate in departmental academic advising, and contribute to service in the department and across campus. The faculty member in this position will teach six courses per year, including Introduction to Neuroscience and an upper-level course in their area of expertise. They will also collaborate with faculty in Biology, Philosophy, and other related fields to strengthen an interdisciplinary minor related to Neuroscience.

A Ph.D. in Psychology, Neuroscience, or a related field is required; ABD candidates who expect to complete their degree by Fall 2019 will be considered. We encourage members of historically under-represented groups to apply.
