



## Visiting Assistant Professor in ESL/Bilingual Education

The Department of Education at Elizabethtown College invites applications for a Visiting Assistant Professor in ESL/Bilingual Education to begin July 1, 2019. The successful candidate will teach undergraduate courses and advise students in the ESL program specialist certification. The candidate will be expected to engage in scholarship and provide service to the department, college, and professional discipline. Applicants should possess an earned doctorate in ESL, bilingual education, or a closely related field, teaching experience in higher education, and knowledge of national standards and trends in ESL/bilingual instruction.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach courses in cultural and linguistic diversity, linguistics, and language acquisition; teach foundational education courses in accordance with departmental needs; supervise student teachers; provide developmental advising; assist with state certification requirements; and establish a clear research agenda, with emphasis upon fostering undergraduate research opportunities.

The candidate will have 1) an earned doctorate from an accredited university in ESL, bilingual education, or a related field; 2) PK-12 teaching experience; 3) a strong background in linguistics, literacy development, and cultural responsiveness; 4) proficiency in teaching with technology; 5) experience teaching in higher education; and 6) excellent communication and collaboration skills.

We are open to a range of additional teaching/research fields that fit the needs of the department, but are especially interested in applicants with diverse backgrounds and experiences who foster inclusive learning environments. Strong candidates will share Elizabethtown College's commitment to Educate for Service and will welcome opportunities to mentor students towards purposeful life outcomes.
