

# Campus Hazing Transparency Report

Elizabethtown College

The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) is a piece of legislation that became law in December 2024 that requires, among other things, institutions develop and distribute a Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR, or "Report") and report hazing statistics in the Annual Security Report as required by the Clery Act.

## Elizabethtown College Hazing Policy & Procedure

Elizabethtown College's policy regarding hazing and the procedures used to prevent it can be found on page 61 of the Student Handbook, <u>linked here</u>. This policy was most recently updated and published on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025.

#### REPORTING PROCESS

Elizabethtown College encourages the reporting of incidents of hazing and takes each report seriously. It will investigate all reports diligently and thoroughly, in accordance with the policies and procedures outlined in the Elizabethtown College Student Handbook. Any person may report an incident of hazing in person, by mail, by telephone or electronic mail, using the contact information listed for Nichole Gonzaez, the <a href="ECTipline">ECTipline</a>, or by utilizing Elizabethtown College's <a href="Public Reporting Form">Public Reporting Form</a>.

### CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT

Per the SCHA, Elizabethtown College will compile and publish relevant and pertinent information<sup>1</sup> regarding each incident of hazing for which a recognized student organization was found responsible. Beginning July 1, 2025; this information will be collected and subsequently published (and updated) twice per year<sup>2</sup>.
