Hershey was also a director of the Cuban Atlantic Sugar Company of New York and a director of the Keystone Macaroni Manufacturing Company of Lebanon. Active In Church An active member of St. Mark's Evangelical and Reformed Church, he taught the Lades' Bible Class of the Sunday School for many years. He was a member of the Lebanon Country Club, the Hershey Country Club, and the Quentin Riding Club. He was a member of the Mt. Lebanon Lodge 226, F and A. M. of Lebanon."




