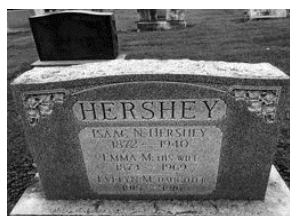
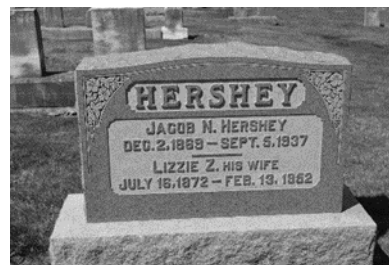


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Jacob Nissley Hershey (1870-1937)

Jacob Nissley Hershey was born on December 2, 1869, and died on September 5, 1937, at age 67. He was buried at Crossroads Cemetery at Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, USA. His parents, along with the parents of the other siblings, are Jacob Garber Hershey (1843-1919) and Mary Lindemuth Nissley Hershey (1886-1956). He married Lizzie Zercher Hershey (1872-1952) and had two children, Roy Zercher Hershey (1895-1973) and Mary Hershey Martin (1898-1999).¹



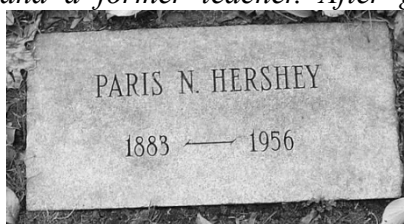
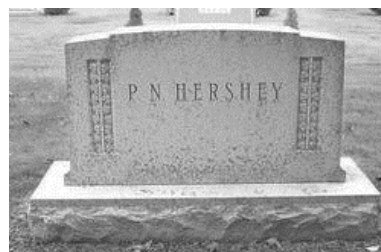
Isaac N Hershey was born on October 11, 1872 in Pennsylvania, USA. He was married to Emma Martin Hershey (1874-1969). He and Emma had five children together, Ruth Miriam Hershey Ohlson (1895-1962), Verna Hershey Kuntzelman (1901-1995), Helen Hershey Wise (1906-1981), Evelyn M Hershey (1915-1916) and Jean H Hershey Kraybill (1918-2009). He died at the age of 67 on April 14, 1940. At the time of his death, he resided, here, in Elizabethtown, PA. He is buried in the Mount Tunnel Cemetery in Elizabethtown, PA.²

Paris Nissley Hershey was born on July 27, 1883 in Florin, Pennsylvania, located in Lancaster County. The following about Paris Hershey was found on Find a Grave:

"He married Clara Whitmer on February 21, 1907, in Lebanon. They were the parents of Gladys Evans (), Harold W. Hershey (1912-1978), Evelyn 'Neenah' Hershey of Wisconsin, and Elynor Horst (1920-1976)." Paris passed away at the age of 73 on December 30, 1956. He is buried in the Hershey Cemetery in Hershey, PA. Paris was a civic leader and pioneering dairy products, manufacturer. He was said to resemble Milton S. Hershey. He was also a well known civic leader and a former teacher. After graduation from



*Marietta High School and Millersville State Teacher College, he taught in public schools of Lancaster County. Later he attended Kansas Agricultural College in Abilene, Kansas. He was a creamery operator of the Lebanon Creamery Company from 1905 to 1912. He was a director of the milk division of the Hershey Chocolate Corporation since 1912, agricultural manager of the Hershey Estates since 1928, and a director of the Hershey Chocolate Corporation. President of the Hershey National Bank since 1946, was also a director of the Fidelity Building and Loan Association of Lebanon, the Hershey Trust Company, and the Hershey Foundation. His civic activities included the following past president of the Lebanon Chamber of Commerce, charter member and past president of the Lebanon Rotary Club, past president of the Lebanon School Board, and a school director for 25 years. Hershey was also a director of the Cuban Atlantic Sugar Company of New York and a director of the Keystone Macaroni Manufacturing Company of Lebanon. Active In Church An active member of St. Mark's Evangelical and Reformed Church, he taught the Lades' Bible Class of the Sunday School for many years. He was a member of the Lebanon Country Club, the Hershey Country Club, and the Quentin Riding Club. He was a member of the Mt. Lebanon Lodge 226, F and A. M. of Lebanon."*³

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Eli Nissley Hershey was born on October 17, 1886 in Florin, PA. Eli married Carrie Mann (1888-1969). Together, they had two children, Jacob Wilbur “Jake” (1912-2000) and Alice Arlene (1915-2005). Eli Hershey passed away on September 21, 1956 in Harrisburg, PA. He was 69 years old at the time. He is buried in Woodland Memorial Gardens in Lower Paxton, PA.⁴
