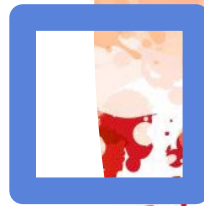





Core Program

- **Exposure to a wide-range of courses and programs:**
 - **First-Year Seminar (FYS)**
 - **Power of Language**
 - **English (PLE)**
 - **“Other”: ancient/modern languages (PLO)**
 - **Mathematics (MA)**
 - **Creative Expressions (CE)**
 - **Western Cultural Heritage (WCH)**
 - **Non-Western Cultural Heritage (NCH)**
 - **Natural and Physical Sciences (NPS)**
 - **Humanities (HUM)**
 - **Social Sciences (SSC)**



One course must also be Guided Writing and Research (GWR).



Signature Learning Experiences

- **Supervised Research**
- **Internships, Field Placements, or Practicums**
- **Capstone Course, Project, or Portfolio**
- **Community-Based Learning**
- **Cross-Cultural Experience**



Students complete two experiences prior to graduation.

First Year Seminar (FYS) – Student Learning Outcomes

- **Demonstrate understanding of the academic expectations of college life.**
- **Demonstrate critical thinking, reading, and composing skills.**
- **Develop informative, inclusive public speaking skills and deliver an effective formal presentation.**
- **Apply introductory information literacy skills based on instruction by a librarian to course assignments.**
- **Relate their opportunities for learning outside the classroom to their academic courses, personal interests, and intended program of study.**

First Year Seminar (FYS)

- **Each includes College skills development and a particular topic/content area**
- **FYS instructor serves as the Academic Advisor**
- **Each FYS also assigned at least one Peer Mentor**
- **Instructor and peer mentor work together to support students and develop a sense of belonging**

New Student Orientation

Learn about the many majors and minors that Etown offers. Meet with faculty in your intended major for advising and to create a plan for course registration.

Course Registration



Prepare to register for your next semester's courses by participating in a peer mentor-led Jay Chat, using the degree and core planners, and meeting with your School faculty and academic advisor.

Spring Advising Connections



Transition to your new academic advisor in your intended major. Exploring students will work with an advisor from the Academic Advising team. You'll work with your advisor to meet your academic goals.

- **Career Services:** Career Action Plan



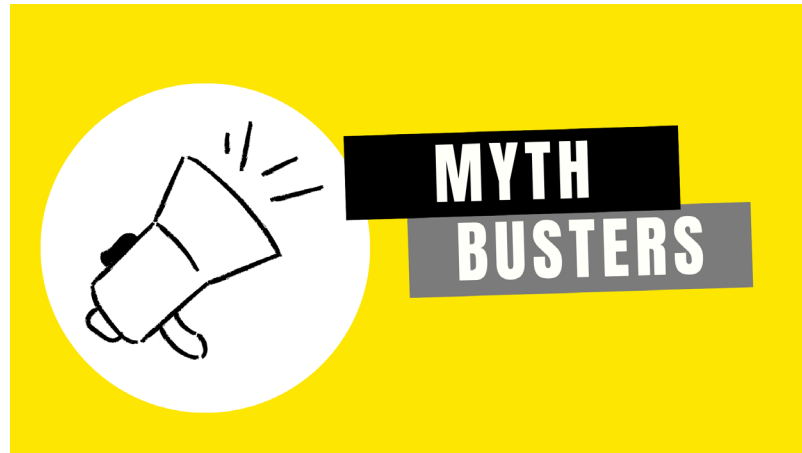
