What is Human Capital Management?

Human capital management involves the wide range of practices and processes for managing people in an organization. Included in this broad view are recruiting and hiring employees, training, employee benefits, retention, and workforce analysis.

Lifestyle and Work-Life Balance

For most positions, a standard work week is expected. Some exceptions may include recruiting positions that require regular travel. Hours may fluctuate to accommodate peak employee recruitment times, benefits enrollment periods, or special training efforts. Organization size will affect the nature of the work, with smaller organizations providing opportunities to draw on a broader skill set right away.
