

Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center (SVMC) trains Brethren ministers answering the call in many seasons of life. Our courses are certificate-level for the ACTS and TRIM programs. Since most SVMC students are working adults, we schedule courses for weekday evenings and Saturdays and hold them in regionally-based locations. A synchronous online option is available for some courses. All students receive individualized attention and quality instruction at highly affordable rates. Laity are also welcome to join our courses for personal enrichment or to explore ministry training.

SVMC courses cover typical subjects such as biblical studies, theology, church history, and ministry skills, but approach these from a perspective grounded in the Anabaptist and Pietist roots of the Church of the Brethren.

ACTS (Academy Certified Training System)

ACTS is a basic certificate program that satisfies ordination requirements. Classes meet on weeknights or Saturdays and are held in all five partner districts. A synchronous online option is available for some courses.

Continuing Education

SVMC offers a robust schedule of Continuing Education opportunities. One-day courses ranging from Brethren history and biblical scholarship to ministry skills and current topics can be taken for re-credentialing (CEUs) or general interest. SVMC invites Bethany Theological Seminary faculty to lead two events per year.

TRIM (Training in Ministry)

Courses that count toward the Brethren Academy’s Training in Ministry certificate serve individuals for whom full-time participation in a college or seminary program is not feasible. Courses are online or synchronous video.
